- The raw material for actionable information and knowledge creation.
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
Background: Health Data

Data Management Services

 An administrative process that includes acquiring validating, storing, and processing required data for accessibility Galetto (2016)

Data management and access is a very new service for libraries requiring development of new skills through training.

Data Management Services in Medical Libraries

Librarians roles include:

- Providing infrastructures such as repositories to preserve and share data
- Advocating for data services and sharing
- Raising awareness on the importance of open data
- Offering training to inculcate data literacy that will empower researchers to deposit, access and use open data.

Rational for the study


- Data librarianship is an emerging field.
- Recently, many librarians are involved in collection, curation and creating access to datasets.
- Medical librarians in Nigeria can be advocates of open data for the public good.
- Hence, the study ascertained, awareness perceptions and data management services.

Methods

- The research surveyed medical librarians in Nigeria.
- Questionnaire was used for data collection.
- The questionnaire was created in SurveyMonkey tool
- Distribution: Medical Library Association of Nigeria email list and WhatsApp group platform
- Fifty one medical librarians responded to the survey

Results


Medical Librarians Awareness of Open Data Initiative



- Almost all respondents 49 (96.1%) claim awareness
- Only 2 (3.9%) indicated no awareness.

Medical Librarians Awareness and Understanding of Open Data Concepts

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Data Services in the Medical Libraries.

- 14 libraries have institutional repository
- No respondent indicated depositing datasets or researchers' data in the repositories
- No advocacy for data management and sharing
- No training on data management

Services Medical Librarians can Perform to Support Open Data Initiatives

Data management services	Frequency	%
Locating datasets for patrons	25	50
Identifying and preparing datasets for deposit into the repository	9	18
Creating metadata for datasets.	8	16
Participating with researchers on a research and data management project	18	36

Medical Librarians Attitude to Data Sharing and Open Data management

- Librarians Attitude was largely supportive of data sharing and data management services.
- A large number, 42 (85.7%) agreed to make their data openly available.
- Almost all respondents 48(98%) are willing to locate datasets for users as part of their duties
- Most (77.6%) disagreed that data management was too technical, or beyond the librarians understanding.
- Most (89.8%) wants Institutions to mandate researchers to store their research data in library repositories.

Discussion

 Results showed good awareness of open data concepts, resources, and positive attitude to data management services.

 Despite the awareness of open data, the medical librarians are yet to commence data services in their various libraries.

Discussion

The findings maybe an indication that these librarians if provided with enabling policies and resources can join their counterparts in developing data services.

Recommendations

- Medical librarians should -
- Innovatively advocate for open data services in their libraries.

 Promote use of open data resources through information literacy programmes.

 integrate open data resources into their collection development policy

Conclusion

• The future and prospects for open data management in libraries in Nigeria depend on a well-developed data librarianship training programme.



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
